New Exhibit on Prince Albert Kauikeaouli Opens at Queen Emma Summer Palace

HONOLULU, HI—the Daughters of Hawai‘i, caretakers of Queen Emma Summer Palace in Nu‘uanu, are pleased to announce the grand opening of a special exhibit featuring the belongings of Prince Albert Edward Kauikeaouli Leiopapa a Kamehameha on Saturday, May 24th, 2008. The event, which is sponsored by the Honolulu Advertiser and commemorates the 150th birthday of the Little Prince, is free and open to the public, and kicks off the first of an upcoming four-part “Kama‘āina Days” series at the Palace.

The festivities will start at 12:00 noon and last until 3:00 pm. A special showcase of the Prince’s belongings (many previously never exhibited), docent-led Palace tours, and fire engine rides for keiki on an authentic 1936 antique fire engine will all be available. Light refreshments will be served in Emmalani Hale, located next to the Palace.

Following the grand opening, the Prince Albert Kauikeaouli exhibit will run for approximately one month, and will be included in the standard tour of Queen Emma Summer Palace (admission fee \$6 adult, \$1 children, \$4 Kama‘āina).

The Daughters of Hawai‘i, a membership-based organization founded in 1903, have dedicated themselves to perpetuating the memory and spirit of the Hawaiian culture and language for over 100 years. The Daughters care for and operate both Queen Emma Summer Palace in Nu‘uanu and Hulihe‘e Palace in Kailua-Kona.
