Together with the Daughters of Hawai'i, Calabash Cousins uphold the mission to preserve Hawai'i's palaces. The Daughters of Hawai'i were organized in 1903 by seven kama'āina women who feared the loss of the Hawaiian culture. The mission of the organization is to perpetuate the memory and spirit of old Hawai'i, its language and historic sites.

The endeavors of the society include restoration and maintenance of two furnished palaces formerly havens for Hawaiian Royalty and now open to the public as museums—The Queen Emma Summer Palace, Hānaikamalama, in Nu'uānu Valley on O'ahu and Hulihe'e Palace in Kailua-Kona on the island of Hawai'i.

Calabash Cousins contribute an annual or lifetime fee and are encouraged to support activities through volunteerism towards our efforts of historic preservation.
